

ORDINANCE NO. 633

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ENHANCED CEREAL MALT BEVERAGE CODE OF THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS, KANSAS UNDER ARTICLE 2 OF CHAPTER 3 BY ADDING SECTION 3-221 AND AMENDING THE ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR CODE OF THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS, KANSAS UNDER ARTICLE 3 OF CHAPTER 3 BY ADDING SECTION 3-307.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS, KANSAS, that Section 3-221 of Article 2 of Chapter 3 of the 2015 Code of the City of St. Francis, Kansas and Section 3-307 of Article 3 of Chapter 3 of the 2015 Code of the City of St. Francis, Kansas are hereby added to the Code of the City of St. Francis, Kansas, and are to read as follows:

3-221 ENHANCED CEREAL MALT BEVERAGE SPECIAL EVENT PERMIT

Section 1. PERMIT REQUIRED. It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or serve any enhanced cereal malt beverage at any special event within the city without first obtaining a local special event permit from the city clerk.

Section 2. PERMIT FEE.

(a) There is hereby levied a special event permit fee in the amount of \$25 on each group or individual, which fee shall be paid before the event begins. Such fee shall be in addition to the \$25 fee to be remitted to the Division of Alcohol Beverage Control.

(b) Every special event permit holder shall cause the permit receipt to be placed in plain view on any premises within the city where the holder of the special event permit is serving enhanced cereal malt beverage for consumption on the premises.

Section 3. CITY SPECIAL EVENT PERMIT.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to serve enhanced cereal malt beverage at a special event without first applying for a local special event permit at least 14 days before the event. Written application for the local special event permit shall be made to the city clerk on the form used for annual enhanced cereal malt beverage sales as directed by the city clerk. In addition to any other information required, the applicant shall provide the following:

- (1) the name of the applicant;
- (2) the group for which the event is planned;
- (3) the location of the event;
- (4) the date and time of the event;
- (5) any anticipated need for police, fire or other municipal services.

(b) Upon meeting the requirements to obtain a special event permit, the city clerk shall issue a local special event permit to the applicant if there are no conflicts with any zoning or other ordinances of the city.

(c) The city clerk shall notify the chief of police whenever a special event permit has been issued and forward a copy of the permit and application to the chief of police.

Section 4. PERMIT REGULATIONS.

- (a) No special event permit holder shall allow the serving of enhanced cereal malt beverage between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. at any event for which a special event permit has been issued.
- (b) No enhanced cereal malt beverage shall be given, sold or traded to any person under 21 years of age.
- (c) No more than four special event permits may be issued in a calendar year to the same applicant.
- (d) No special event permit issued hereunder may be transferred or assigned to any other vendor.
- (e) All local ordinances and state statutes for the sale and consumption of enhanced cereal malt beverage apply to holders of special event permits.

3-307 ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR SPECIAL EVENT PERMIT

Section 1. PERMIT REQUIRED. It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or serve any alcoholic liquor at any special event within the city without first obtaining a local special event permit from the city clerk.

Section 2. PERMIT FEE.

- (a) There is hereby levied a special event permit fee in the amount of \$25 on each group or individual, which fee shall be paid before the event begins. Such fee shall be in addition to the \$25 fee to be remitted to the Division of Alcohol Beverage Control.
- (b) Every special event permit holder shall cause the permit receipt to be placed in plain view on any premises within the city where the holder of the special event permit is serving alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises.

Section 3. CITY SPECIAL EVENT PERMIT.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to serve alcoholic liquor at a special event without first applying for a local special event permit at least 14 days before the event. Written application for the local special event permit shall be made to the city clerk on the form used for annual alcoholic liquor sales as directed by the city clerk. In addition to any other information required, the applicant shall provide the following:
 - (1) the name of the applicant;
 - (2) the group for which the event is planned;
 - (3) the location of the event;
 - (4) the date and time of the event;
 - (5) any anticipated need for police, fire or other municipal services.
- (b) Upon meeting the requirements to obtain a special event permit, the city clerk shall issue a local special event permit to the applicant if there are no conflicts with any zoning or other ordinances of the city.
- (c) The city clerk shall notify the chief of police whenever a special event permit has been issued


and forward a copy of the permit and application to the chief of police.

Section 4. PERMIT REGULATIONS.

- (a) No special event permit holder shall allow the serving of alcoholic liquor between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. at any event for which a special event permit has been issued.
- (b) No alcoholic liquor shall be given, sold or traded to any person under 21 years of age.
- (c) No more than four special event permits may be issued in a calendar year to the same applicant.
- (d) No special event permit issued hereunder may be transferred or assigned to any other vendor.
- (e) All local ordinances and state statutes for the sale and consumption of alcoholic liquor apply to holders of special event permits.

This amendment to the 2015 Code of the City of St. Francis, Kansas shall be effective upon its publication in the *St. Francis Herald and Bird City Times*.
